  - a. Jeff Bartig: Traveling in Wyoming. Traffic has been ramping up over last week or two. Should have seen a jump in traffic as semesters restart.   - i. Farmer: right now for R& E table: I2 takes view that it's an issue for peers. This is perhaps not a helpful routing policy. I2 should be NOT accepting things from peers that don't make sense. EG, should not accept GEANT routes from APAC.
  - ii. For example, lots of routes from French overseas colonies that are in Caribbean or south America. We are accepting from various APAC networks. So we are sending traffic around the globe to get to the Caribbean. Not logical. Probably not intentional.
  - iii. We should doing more of a belt and suspenders thing: should be a high level of things that we do not accept. Eg, accepting routes through peers form a third party is normally not an acceptable thing to do.
  - iv. Likely because global R&E network has evolved. Stance at time was that 12 would not filter peers. Could probably be done with a handful of ASpath.
  - v. Steve Wallace: MOU generally accept anything other than BOGON. Could be opportunity for a international call with a well-structured agenda. Would probably be mutually beneficial. Could get a read on where.
  - vi. Lambert: Should revive Brent Sweeney's RENOG.

- vii. Ryan Harden: there is a dedicated slack workspace for most NRENs.

  Could use to build agenda and start discussion and figure out WHO to talk to about it. Could cause problems by asking questions to wrong people.
